MRF Construction Update

Construction of our new facility is on track to be completed after the first of the year. The MRF section is finished, and machinery installation is underway. By January, all equipment will be in place, and we'll begin training and fine-tuning the system to ensure optimal performance. Once the machinery is operational we will begin taking small amounts of materials from municipalities. Baler Install Underway

Marathon was on-site to begin the installation of the baler, a critical piece of equipment in our recycling operations. The baler plays an essential role in our process by compressing the processed and separated materials into compact bales. These bales are then prepared for transportation and sale to recycling end markets, where they will be reused in the manufacturing of new products. This new installation will not only improve the efficiency of our operations, but also increase our capacity to handle larger volumes of recyclable materials, helping us better meet the demands of our recycling partners. We are excited about the positive impact this investment will have on our sustainability goals and look forward to its completion!
