MRF Update



In June, the Baldwin County MRF processed 188.79 tons of material and shipped out 217.77 tons. This included 153.62 tons of Old Corrugated Cardboard and 64.15 tons of mixed paper.

These materials were sent to Midland Davis and Pratt Industries for recycling into new products—helping reduce landfill waste and support a circular economy.

Have you been wondering if any items at the CHaRM come with a fee? Wonder no more! Below is a list of items and their associated drop-off prices at the CHaRM.

| ltem | Cost |
|------------------------------|-----------------|
| Residential Paint | \$2.00/gallon |
| Commercial Paint | \$15.00/gallon |
| Household Hazardous Waste | \$2.00/gallon |
| Car Batteries | \$2.00/ battery |
| Tanks | \$4.00/ tank |
| Small Electronics | \$5.00/ unit |
| Large Electronics | \$10.00/ unit |


- At any of our existing recycling drop-off locations throughout the community
