MRF Update



In August, the Baldwin County Materials
Recovery Facility (MRF) received a total of
369.74 tons of recyclable materials from
residential, commercial, and municipal sources
across the region. Of this total, 207.34 tons were
successfully exported to certified recycling end
markets such as Greif, International Paper, and
Midland Davis. These materials are now on
track to be transformed into new products,
supporting the circular economy and helping
reduce the demand for virgin resources.

On September 20th, the 38th Annual Alabama Coastal Cleanup took place across Mobile and Baldwin Counties, with volunteers cleaning up litter from waterways and shorelines in 28 designated zones. The SWDA proudly supported the effort by providing containers at each location to ensure proper disposal and recycling.

Volunteers were able to collect 4.68 tons (9,360 pounds) of materials from just 9 of the 28 locations where SWDA containers were placed—demonstrating the community's strong commitment to protecting our coastal environment.


America Recycles Day

Want curbside recycling but not sure if it's available in your area? Check out this map to see when service will start near you.

Curbside recycling makes it easy to reduce waste and protect the environment—sign up today and start recycling right at your doorstep!

- Daphne (inside/outside city limits, west of 181 and south of I-10 Active
- 2. Belforest, Daphne (inside/outside city limits, east of 181 and north I-10), Malbis, and Spanish Forts Stonebridge Active
- 3. Loxley and Summerdale (inside/outside of city limits) **Starts October**6th, 2025
- 4. Bromley, Carpenter, Crossroads, Hurricane, Spanish Fort (inside/outside city limits) Stapleton, Steelwood, Pine Haven, Whitehouse Forks Starts December 1st, 2025
- Barnwell, Clay City, Fairhope (outside city limits), Marlow, and Magnolia Springs (inside/outside city limits) Starts February 2nd,
- 6. Lillian, Silverhill (inside/outside city limits), and Ono Island **Starts**April 6th, 2026
- 7. Bon Secour and Foley (outside city limits), Gulf Shores (outside city limits) **Starts June 1**st, **2026**
- 8. Elsanor, Gateswood, Robertsdale (inside/outside city limits), Rosinton, Seminole **Starts August 3rd, 2026**
- 9. Bay Minette (inside/outside city limits), Blacksher, Georgetown, Gopher Hill, Latham, Little River, Lottie, Phillipsville, Rabun, Redtown, Stockton, Tensaw, and Vangordon Starts October 5th, 2026
- 10. Elberta (inside/outside city limits), Fort Morgan, Josephine, Miflin, Perdido Beach **Starts December 7**th, **2026**


- At any of our existing recycling drop-off locations throughout the community
