ACCEPTED ITEMS & FEES

FREE DROP-OFFS

Bring these items at no charge:

Aluminum Cans	Glass Bottles and Jars
Plastics (TYPES 1-7)	Mixed Paper (PAPER, CEREAL BOXES, SODA BOXES)
Light Bulbs (INCANDESCENT, CFLS, LEDS)	Small Household Batteries (AA, AAA, BUTTON CELLS)
Cardboard (SHIPPING BOXES)	

HARD TO RECYCLE MATERIALS

A small handling fee applies to ensure safe,
responsible processing of these items:

Residential Paint	\$2/gal	Household Hazardous Waste (CHEMICALS/LIQUIDS, GASOLINE, PESTICIDES)	\$2/gal
Car Batteries	\$2/ea	Tanks (PROPANE, FIRE EXTINGUISHER)	\$4/tank
Electronics (TVS, PHONES, LAPTOPS)	\$5/unit		

WHAT NOT TO BRING

how recyclables are processed.

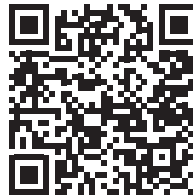
SECOND FLOOR

WHY IT MATTERS

Recycling isn't just the right thing to do, it's one
of the most effective ways to protect Baldwin
County's environment and natural resources:



Recycling cardboard uses 75%
less energy than producing new
cardboard and saves 9 cubic yards
of landfill space per ton.



Recycling plastic uses 88% less energy
and saves the equivalent of up to
2,000 gallons of gasoline per ton.



Recycling one aluminum can saves
enough energy to power a TV for
3 hours.
